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**MA Department of Public Health (MDPH)**  
**Bureau of Substance Abuse Services (BSAS)**

The MDPH-BSAS oversees the substance abuse and gambling prevention and treatment services in the Commonwealth. Responsibilities include: licensing programs and counselors; funding and monitoring prevention and treatment services; providing access to treatment for the indigent and uninsured; developing and implementing policies and programs; and tracking substance abuse trends in the state.

**Office of Youth and Young Adult Services (OYYAS)**

OYYAS staff design, implement, and oversee programs, policies, and initiatives that are created by the Bureau to address substance abuse issues among youth and young adults. Responsibilities include: building and maintaining system capacity across the continuum of care, providing effective, accessible, and affordable substance abuse treatment for youth and their families, which utilize evidenced based practices, are youth focused, inclusive of family and caregiver involvement, in coordination with other state agencies and youth service providers.

### **Finding the right treatment for adolescents.**

If you or someone you care for is experiencing difficulties due to their alcohol and/or other drug use, here are some questions to consider when selecting a service or treatment program:

Does the provider or program accept your health insurance?  
If not, will they work with you on a payment plan, have a sliding scale, or find other means of payment for you?

Is the program state licensed, and are staff licensed professionals trained in addiction treatment?

Does the program offer a full range of services needed to support an individual's recovery process, including help for substance abuse and mental health problems if applicable?

Does the program provide treatment services that are appropriate and sensitive to age, gender, race, sexual orientation, culture, and physical abilities?

Will there be ongoing assessment of an individual's treatment plan to ensure that it meets their changing needs?

Are services or referrals offered to family members to support their understanding of addiction and the recovery process? How does it help guide them in supporting the recovering individual?

Is aftercare support and referral encouraged and provided?

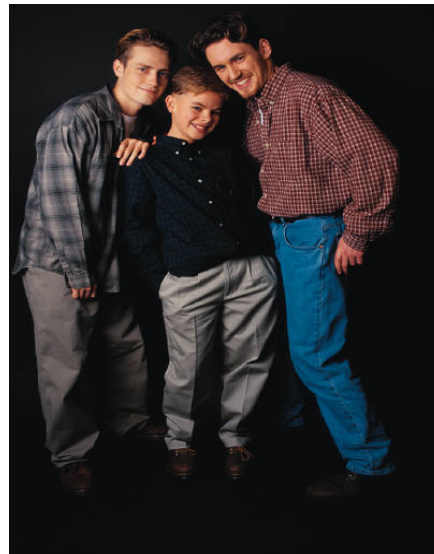

### Youth Stabilization and Detoxification Units

The Bureau of Substance Abuse Services (BSAS) in seeking to create an effective and responsive continuum of substance abuse treatment services for adolescents, as well as to meet a growing demand for acute care, created in 2007 the first state-funded youth stabilization and detoxification unit in Massachusetts. These units provide youth in crisis with a safe, temporary, protective environment in which they can receive the care, supervision, assessment, and medical monitoring necessary to facilitate stabilization of their physical and emotional states.

Once stabilized, youth receive a comprehensive bio-psycho-social assessment of their substance use, social, emotional, behavioral, and mental health needs. With this information, staff can develop appropriate aftercare resources and referrals for adolescents and their family.

The youth stabilization and detoxification services are for males and females between the ages of 13 and 17. Their length of stay is determined on their individual assessment and treatment planning needs, (an average stay is 14 days). Insurance may cover the cost of these services.

### Youth Residential Treatment Programs

Residential substance abuse treatment is appropriate for youth experiencing health, emotional/behavioral, family, developmental and/or social problems as a result of alcohol and other drug use, and whose issues have not been resolved in less intense, community-based levels of care. There are currently five gender-specific residential programs (three male and two female programs). These are short-term substance abuse treatment services for medically stable youth. Four of the programs serve youth between the ages of 13 and 17, with one program serving female young adults. A youths length of stay (up to 90 days) in the program varies based on their treatment needs.

Qualified staff create an individualized treatment plan for each adolescent. Each youth participates in highly structured, developmentally appropriate individual, group, and family clinical services. An in-house educational coordinator develops educational objectives with the adolescent's school from his/her community. Continuing care services are provided to assist the youth in recovery upon completion. Services include relapse prevention education, follow-up planning, and integration to community resources and/or outpatient programs.

## Youth Residential Treatment Programs (Continued)

The youth residential programs are funded by the Bureau of Substance Abuse Services and a sliding-scale client cost-share policy. At intake, the program will review the sliding scale with families, and if a family can contribute to the cost of treatment they are asked to, however cost should not be a barrier for youth in receiving treatment. Every effort is made to see that youth are served within their communities, as appropriate. However, programs will accept youth from across the state and will coordinate and provide transportation as needed. Programs are located in: Danvers (males), Boston (males), Springfield (males), Lawrence (females), and Worcester (females).

## Recovery Homes

Recovery homes offer a structured transitional living setting, for young people aged 16 to 19, working towards independent sober living. There are two gender-specific residential programs in South Boston that utilize a recovery home model.

Operated by the Gavin Foundation, Inc., the Cushing Houses provide a stabilizing transitional care residence for young men and women experiencing substance abuse problems.

The programs provide a nurturing, structured and safe environment for young people while promoting self-care, self-reliance, and community responsibility, through structured activities and the experience of living in a residential milieu. Young people may stay up to 6 months. Services include; assessment, comprehensive substance abuse treatment, mental health counseling planning and referral, case management and coordination, psycho-education, life skills enhancement, vocational/educational support, recovery support, parents support group, and after-care planning.

### Recovery High Schools

Recovery high schools are four-year, non-traditional public high schools for youth who are experiencing a substance use disorder. The concept of recovery high schools originated in Minnesota in 1989, as a response to the high rates of relapse among adolescents who returned from a treatment experience to a traditional high school.

The Massachusetts schools are located in Boston, Beverly, and Springfield. They have the capacity to serve approximately 30-50 students each, and each of the schools utilizes a slightly different operational model.

The schools provide a comprehensive academic curriculum that is consistent with Massachusetts State Standards, MCAS testing protocols, and course requirements of the students school district. All of the schools have the capacity to serve students who have individualized education plans (IEP).

The schools actively support students in their recovery by providing smaller class sizes, individualized attention, licensed counseling services, and daily group meetings where students have the opportunity to process issues related to both education and recovery. The schools strongly encourage and provide opportunities for parent involvement and are jointly funded by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Abuse Services and local school districts.

Presently there are five programs, supported by MDPH/BSAS, in the Commonwealth, which provide support services focused both on engaging the adolescent or adult with a substance use disorder into treatment and/or recovery services, as well as providing ongoing support, skill building, and resource development for the individual's family.

### **School-Based CASASTART Intervention Programs**

CASASTART is a community-based, school-centered intervention program for youth, which has proven positive outcomes for youth, their families, and the community. CASASTART serves youth 8 to 13 years old who are at high risk for or involved in delinquency, substance abuse, or experiencing family violence, school failure, or social and behavioral problems. Case workers use a positive youth development framework and intensive case management to coordinate and provide services. The MA Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Abuse Services supports the CASASTART intervention model with programs currently running in South Boston, Dorchester, and Winthrop.

## Department of Youth Services (DYS) CASASTART Intervention Programs

The MA Department of Public Health, Bureau of Substance Abuse Services has partnered with the MA Department of Youth Services (DYS) to adapt and implement a juvenile justice CASASTART model across the Commonwealth utilizing the core of CASASTART to address the needs of youth in the juvenile justice system. There are currently six sites across the state: Holyoke, Springfield, Lawrence, Lowell, Dorchester, and Roxbury. In order to participate, a youth must be willing to engage for at least one year, be at risk for using alcohol and other drugs, and have family members willing to participate.

## SAFE

SAFE is a capacity building initiative aimed to increase treatment admissions across the Commonwealth, for underserved adolescent populations with substance use disorders. This project is funded by MDPH/BSAS and is managed by the Institute for Health and Recovery (IHR). SAFE offers consultation to adolescent providers, workshops to educate parents and community providers about available substance use treatment resources for adolescents, co-facilitation of psycho-educational drug and alcohol groups for adolescents using a train-the-trainer model, co-facilitation of parent support groups for parents with adolescents using drugs and alcohol using a train-the-trainer model and the curriculum “**Parent Time: Supporting Yourself & Your Child**”, peer leader trainings on adolescent substance use issues, and evidenced based treatment and case management services for youth with substance use issues who may not access traditional forms of treatment. IHR has also been able to introduce a “**Wellness Curriculum**”, designed to enhance existing treatment services and support recovery maintenance by promoting overall health, wellbeing, lifestyle choices and self-care.

### **Statewide Ballot Initiative**

On November 4, 2008, MA voters passed Ballot Question 2, “An Act Establishing a Sensible State Marijuana Policy.” The new law became effective on January 2, 2009. Youth under 18, who receive a citation for possessing under an ounce of marijuana, must complete a Drug Awareness Program (at least four hours of a drug awareness class), ten hours of community service, and pay a \$100 fine. Classroom sessions are scheduled throughout the state based on demand. The BSAS, Question 2 Project Specialist, provides state-wide coordination of the Drug Awareness Program thru the Institute for Health and Recovery (IHR).
